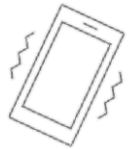

Indiana Pregnancy Promise Program: The Indiana Pregnancy Promise Program is a free, voluntary program for pregnant Medicaid members who are currently affected by, or have a history of, substance use disorders. The goals of the Pregnancy Promise Program are to help participants enter prenatal care and address other health needs, access treatment services to support and sustain recovery, receive ongoing support for both mother and infant during pregnancy and for up to 12 months after birth, and build hope while establishing a strong foundation for the future. The Pregnancy Promise Program is available to pregnant women throughout the State of Indiana. To be eligible, participants must be pregnant or within 90 days after the end of a pregnancy, identify as having a current or previous substance use disorder, and be eligible for or currently receiving Medicaid health coverage.
